Perdue Pegboard Dexterity Test

- Developed by:
 - Joseph Tiffin, Ph.D., an Industrial Psychologist at Purdue University in 1948
- Aims: selection of employees for industrial jobs
- Application:
 - Presence of brain damage
 - Presence of learning disability
 - Candidates for vocational rehabilitation
- Measurements:
 - gross movements of hands, fingers and arms
 - fine fingertip dexterity
- Standardized test

Perdue Pegboard Dexterity Test Five subtests : 1- Right hand 2- Left hand 3- Both hands 4- Right plus left plus both hands (R+L+B)5- Assembly

- Three test trials highly recommended
- In consecutive order except left handed subjects

Perdue Pegboard Dexterity Test

Equipment required

- Instruction manual
- Test board
- Pins, collars, washers
- Score sheets
- Stop watch
- The subject must be seated throughout the assessment

 - Barbara A Wilson, Janet Cockburn and Alan Baddeley, 2003
- Purpose:
 - Detect impairment of every day memory functions and to monitor change following treatment for memory difficulties

Population:

- Adolescent & adults
- Administration:
 - Individual 25 to 30 minutes

• Subtests:

- Remembering an appointment
- Remembering a short route
- Remembering a belonging
- Remembering to deliver a message
- Picture recognition Orientation
- Story recall: immediate and delayed
- Remembering a name
- Face recognition

- Good reliability
- 12 sub-test covering a range of every day capabilities
- 4 parallel versions to avoid practice effects due to repeated testing

- Equipment required:
 - Manual
 - Scoring sheet
 - Timer
 - Stimulus books
 - Envelope marked "message"

The Rivermead Behavioral Memory Test Demonstration

- Interpreting the scores
 - Screening score-pass/fail (篩選分數)
 - Standardized profile score (標準分數)
- Level of memory functions
 - Normal
 - Poor memory
 - Moderately impaired
 - Severely impaired

Perdue Pegboard Dexterity Test Possible problems found:

- gross movements of hands, fingers and arms
- fine fingertip dexterity
- Bilateral hands coordination

- Remedial activities
- Vocational rehabilitation
- Supportive employment
