People are also more prone to abuse drugs when faced with personal challenges, family problems or other sorts of adversities in life.

Create Our Magical Sky

First 18-district anti-drug campaign funded by Beat Drugs Fund

STARTING from January this year, Hong Kong Casting Magic Circus (香港愛心魔法團) – a charity established with tax exemption under Section 104 of Hong Kong Inland Revenue Ordinance – was launched in the territory. This new, 18-district anti-drug campaign “Create Our Magical Sky (COMS)” is sponsored by the Beat Drugs Fund (禁毒基金). The objective of this project is to create an awareness about drug abuse in people from all walks of life, especially secondary school students. Through magic-recreation activities and training, students are encouraged to develop their self-confidence and communication skills. Through promoting harmonious peer relationships and a positive mental attitude, the scheme helps reinforce youngsters’ determination to hold firm and say “NO” to drugs.

The 30-volunteer organising committee of COMS has successfully presented its first anti-drug magic event, despite having less than five weeks in which to prepare. The kick-off event was held on February 19, 2011 at Hong Kong Community College.

The two Units of Honour were Ir. Samson Tam – Legislative Council Member IT Sector and member of Action Committee Against Narcotics – and Mr Victor Lo – Political Assistant to the Secretary for Security. They presented over 50 certificates of appreciation to all advisers, supporting entities and individuals.

With the support of about 300 participants, guests performed anti-drug magic on stage, followed by the anti-drug magic and singing performance of the Magic Anti-Drug Ambassadors. After calling out the anti-drug slogans of COMS, the blank books that had been handed out at the beginning of the event were turned into sea turtles and colourful using albums. Furthermore, guests shared their healthy lifestyle tips and magic from various perspectives and experiences with participants, the most impressive scene was when the group song was performed by all participants (without music), which led to the initiation of the second stage of the 18-district all secondary school anti-drug magic drama competition.

Time flies, and after two months, the first round of the competition has been completed. School teams have submitted their applications and summaries of their anti-drug magic drama to be assessed by the Review Committee. To our amazement, 22

outstanding teams have been selected to enter the semi-final round of the competition. The teams are from secondary schools from 13 districts throughout the territory, including Wan Chai, Eastern, Sham Shui Po, Kowloon City, Wong Tai Sin, Kwan Tsang, Tsuen Mun, Yuen Long North, Tai Po, Sha Tin, Sai Kung, and Islands. The complete list of semi-finalists will be announced very soon. These exceptional teams will undergo a training workshop on the competition rules and magic training in mid-May. With creativity, they need to incorporate 10 preset magic tricks in a 10-minute video with their anti-drug drama. Eight teams will be selected for the final competition to be held in November. Additionally, anti-drug healthy campus magic will visit schools that have teams in the semi-finals, as well as other invited schools.

On April 15 after a panel review, 22 outstanding teams from 19 secondary schools, representing 13 districts in Hong Kong, achieved a breakthrough in the first-ever anti-drug magic drama competition in the city (see Table One). These youths successfully created their anti-drug stories selected for the semi-final round of the competition.

On May 14, a three-hour universal training session was launched for all outstanding teams at the Mong Kok Community Hall. Participants underwent a training workshop. During the workshop, students were taught drama skills and information about drama production as well as magic. The workshop aimed to prepare students from the 19 schools for the second stage of the competition.

In this second stage, each team is required to master a 10-minute anti-drug magic drama video to compete to become a finalist. Teams have to incorporate 10 sets of pre-determined magic into their storylines. Volunteers and council members from Hong Kong Caring Magic Circus (HKCMC) will present the magic training. A training video will be published on the website of the event.

“All roads lead to Rome!” said Wilson Wan, President Chairman of HKCMC. “Studies show that magic helps boost one's confidence, creativity and communication ability, whilst the magic training builds dreams for our youths to get them away from drugs.”

“Each type of magic has its different philosophy, and different people will interpret them differently. However, the common mission is to educate the public on the danger of drug abuse and to stop the latter,” said Nicky Lam, chairman of the organizing committee of the anti-drug magic drama competition.

Furthermore, the first anti-drug healthy campus magic visits to outstanding schools will be held early next month. Please keep an eye out for updates. For more information of the competition, visit www.caringmagic.org/anti-drug-magic-drama-competition.

LIFE is full of happiness as well as sadness. However, it is your choice to be a cheerful or sad person. Doing volunteer work brings joy not just to the people you are helping but also to yourself. Performing magic is one of the ways to help others. This is what the students at Yan Oni Hospital Wong Wha San Secondary School learnt.

The third Anti-Drug Healthy School Visit

“WE like magic!” shouted the students from the outstanding team from Yan Oni Hospital Wong Wha San Secondary School. They have entered the semi-finals of the magic drama competition launched by Hong Kong Caring Magic Circus (HKCMC). When Magic Wilson Wan, the Council Chairman of HKCMC, taught them some magic after the anti-drug school visit, they all looked amazed.

HKCMC made its third anti-drug campus visit this time to Yan Oni Hospital Wong Wha San Secondary School, on June 28. The anti-drug campus visit was one of the highlights of the 18-district anti-drug campaign “Create Our Magical Sky” (sponsored by Best Drugs Fund), which aims to promote an anti-drug message throughout the territory. Representatives and volunteers from HKCMC will visit secondary schools from the 18 districts who have outstanding teams entering the semi-finals of the magic drama competition.

Students and teachers in this school were very interested in what HKCMC had to say. “It is very creative to use magic to bring out the anti-drug message,” said Mok Man-pan, one of the students from the participating team. “This could catch more students’ attention so that more people know (about) the damage of drug abuse.”

“Our school always supports the building of a ‘No Drug’ campus,” said Mr Chan Chuen-tak, the teacher-in-charge of the magic drama competition. “In our school, we have a civil education team and an Anti-Drug band to promote the anti-drug message. We also ask students’ opinions about the trial scheme on School Drug Testing by using questionnaires.” He also considered inviting HKCMC again to have another anti-drug magic show for the junior students.

When asked about the tips of leading a healthy and happy life, Chan Hoi-wai said students should join more extra-curricular activities and explore their own talents. Additionally, Mok Man-pan and Liu Kwok-leung said

“When the elderly think the magic is amazing, I will feel more confident!” said Mok. “Helping others always makes me feel very happy. When you bring happiness to others, you may also feel very happy,” said Mr Chan. “These students joined the HKCMC competition. Though they did not win the competition, this is absolutely a great experience for them!”

Healthy tips for young people

Magical interviews with advisors



WHEN asked for advice to help young people resist drugs, Mr. Lo, who has great experience in youth leadership development, thinks that teens should develop a right attitude towards their lives.

"Attitude could easily influence our thinking and action," said Mr. Lo. "Since teenagers are easily influenced by their peers, they should be careful in selecting friends."

He also emphasized the harmful consequences of drug abuse. "Drugs adversely seriously damage their brain function, respiratory system, urinary system, and other body systems. So it is wise to stay away from drugs," he believed that young people of today could build their lives more positively.

"Young people may encounter problems or pressure from various aspects of their lives, such as family, study, love affairs, etc. Communication ability is another crucial element in solving problems. Mr.

Lo used two means to illustrate the "magic office" when both parents and children are willing to communicate with each other.

"If they have in-depth communication by heart, problems can be solved," Mr. Lo said. "Additionally, when teenagers feel unhappy, they should talk to their friends, family members or social workers who are trustworthy. The magic tip is to stay away from drugs."

To develop a healthy life, one can participate in social services. "Young people are energetic. They should explore their own interests, such as playing magic, sports, or joining uniform groups such as the Civil Aid Service (義勇隊) and Auxiliary Medical Service Team (醫療義工)," said Mr. Lo. "Through various disciplinary training and community or medical services, not only can we help the needs, but we can also help develop our civic responsibilities." Mr. Lo also shared a similar view. "Social services can enhance our personal growth and help others."

The anti-drug drama competition launched by HKCMC has been released. Mr. Lo thinks so matter what the results, students should treasure what they have learned during the process, such as the cooperation between groups.

They should also learn from others' good work. Mr. Lo has great confidence in the participants. "To see that they would perform well in their magic drama show. Let's work hard for the final competition!" Mr. Lo stated.

The interview with Mr. Lo was conducted at The Hong Kong Jockey Club Drug Info Centre (DRIC) at the Lower Block of Government Offices. The centre provides valuable resources for anti-drug education with interactive media information. It provides good reference for students and the public in doing research on anti-drug topics.

Interview with Dr Samson Tam Wai-ho

The interview - with Dr Samson Tam Wai-ho, member of the Legislative Council (Information Technology) as well as a member of the Action Committee Against Narcotics (禁毒專責委員會) - was hosted by Mr. Fiona Chan, a professional camera and TV programme host, at the previous offices of the Legislative Council in Central.

Social workers working on the Internet. With the advancement of technology, the Internet plays an important role in the life of young people. Every day, tremendous amounts of information flow through our screens. However, young people are easily confused and cannot differentiate between good and bad information, and are therefore prone to receive negative influence from the latter. With solid experience in the field of information technology, Dr Samson Tam proposed introducing the idea of "Internet Social Workers" working on the Internet. Social workers could use the Internet as a platform to contact and share with those who are in need. For example, marginalized young people, by providing more care and guidance for young people they would be more confident when facing difficulties. With a more positive

personality, young people can have better measures to solve problems and stay away from drugs," said Dr Tam.

High EQ - key to a happy life

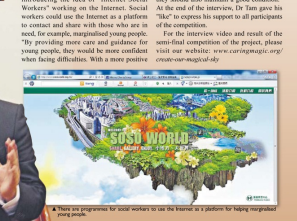
Apart from that, "building up a high EQ (Emotional Quotient) is the key to a happier life. We should learn how to manage our emotions," said Dr Tam while sharing healthy tips with teenagers. "Also, young people should develop their talents and creativity. When they have better room for development, they would live a healthier and happier life."

Additionally, he also advised teenagers to do more volunteer work to enrich their experience and create more meaningful life.

The finalists of the 18-District Anti-Drug Magic Drama Competition were announced recently. Dr Tam encouraged the finalists to keep on the good work. "Apart from good preparation for the drama and magic skills, they should also maintain a good conduct."

At the end of the interview, Dr Tam gave his "tip" to express his support to all participants of the competition.

Magical tips for a healthy life – interview with Lina Yan Hau-ye

Formula for a happy life: "body, heart and soul"

"BODY, heart and soul (身·心·靈) are keys to a healthy life". Lina Yan Hau-ye first shared her views of a healthy life with the Hong Kong Caring Magic Circus. Yan is one of the honourable advisors of the 18-district magic anti-drug project "Create Our Magical Sky" funded by the Best Drugs Fund.

"Although society is affected by the problem of drug-abuse, I have great confidence in young people these days," said Yan. "They need to develop a correct value system and learn how to differentiate right from wrong. A strong mind and critical thinking ability plus communication with experienced people are very important in tackling the threat of drug-abuse."

Yan continued, "To keep our body at optimal level, youngsters should have a balanced diet, proper exercise and adequate sleep – in other words, early to bed and early to rise." She added that "the relationship between happiness and health are just like twins who are very close and interrelated."

Yan believes that "To keep a healthy heart, always think positively and learn to forgive others. When we can achieve these, we can always be cheerful and optimistic." Furthermore, "To re-assure a positive soul, young people should explore ways to develop inner confidence, establish a good reading habit and add value to oneself by continuous learning and self-enhancement."

Yan also stressed that young people should not only learn how to express their love and compassion towards one another, but should also learn how to accept the same from their parents and families, on the way towards a healthy life.

Eight Magic Teams Selected for Final

AFTER a prolonged journey of two rounds of competition, eight outstanding teams have been selected from 18 districts representing their schools for the final round of the competition, "No-Drug Magic Ring (無毒魔法擂台)". Each team demonstrated their 10-minute live anti-drug magic drama to deliver the positive living and anti-drug messages to over 400 attendees.

ON November 5, 2011, the Hong Kong Caring Magic Circus (HKCMC) launched the first-ever 18-district anti-drug magic drama competition under the project "Create Our Magical Sky". It was funded by the Best Drugs Fund at the multi-purpose hall of the Hong Kong Community College – West Kowloon Campus, the venue sponsor of the event.

After the two-hour competition, the championship went to the team from the Holy Carpenter Secondary School, which, at the same time, won five out of eleven prizes. The first runner-up and second runner-up went to the Chinese Foundation Secondary School and Fukien Secondary School (Su Sai Wan), respectively. Other awards and outstanding team prizes are listed below. Overall, the teams successfully presented interesting and creative stories that integrated magic and anti-drug messages. The audience could sense the commitment and heart-felt delivery of the messages from every team member. Cheering squads also did a great job in supporting their representatives. Everything from planning, invitations, script writing and video-shooting, right up to the final competition, happened in just 10 months. It marked another milestone in the success of anti-drug education as it further illustrated the fact that "Where there is a will, there is a way". If we believe, Magic always happens.

Distinguished Panel of Judges

The judge panel comprised artists, magic professionals, educationalists and community leaders. According to the panel's chief judge, Lina Yan Hau-ye (MH, JP), this was the first time she had seen a panel with so many distinguished judges from different sectors. "The interesting part is that the marks are given in four categories by four groups of independent judges responsible for their own area (on positive and healthy life, drama elements, magic elements and anti-drug elements)," said Ms Yan. "It is really an achievement in history to put magic, drama and anti-drug actions together. The former acts as a catalyst to multiply the effect of anti-drug messages through dramatic acts. It is wonderful!"
