Project Objectives

Stated in our application, "Concerted Efforts to Safeguard our Community from Drugs" was an important attempt of the Hong Kong Medical Association (HKMA) to bring together community doctors, to utilize and strengthen existing doctors networks, and to develop and widen our networks with other actors at the district level. The objectives were to increase awareness of youth drug abuse problems at the community level, and to enhance the general public's knowledge on drug abuse.

Educational Flyers

Two flyers, i.e. "Anti-Youth Drug Abuse", and "Youth's Abuse of Cough Syrup and Organic Solvent", were made. The flyer, "Anti-Youth Drug Abuse", told the physical and legal impact of taking or possessing drugs. The other flyer, Youth's Abuse of Cough Syrup and Organic Solvent" elaborated the immediate and long-term impact of these substances on health. Both leaflets aimed at educating teenagers the harm of drugs in simple and clear terms. **265,000 copies of each flyers** (cf. the original target of 200,000 copies), were published and distributed to students in Hong Kong via schools and NGOs and during the public education day.

Feedback from schools that some teachers used these flyers as supplementary teaching materials. Where flyers were sent before the "Drug Free Community" Design Competitions, these could serve as reference materials for the participants and provided knowledge basis for them to build on. Public education day participants also received these leaflets and were tested on their understanding by two questionnaires.

Five Beat Drugs Design Competitions

Five "Drugs Free Community" Design Competitions were held in New Territories West, Hong Kong Island and outlying islands, Tai Po, Shatin and Kowloon districts. The Competitions created a platform for citizens, especially the teenagers, to utilize their creativity and spread the beat drugs message. While working on their entries, teenagers were encouraged to look into the drugs abuse problems, rethink and reflect on the adversities in life and develop a positive attitude towards life, and presented their views to the public. For younger children, the Competitions successfully cultivate a correct attitude against drug abuse at an early stage by engaging schools and parents.

The five Competitions drew a lot of attention with the help of school heads associations and federations of parents and

teachers associations. Many of the applications were of high standard. A total of 8,797 entries were received, tripled the project target of 2,500.

Five Public Education Days

Five public education days were organised in Tuen Mun Town Plaza, Youth Square, Tai Po Mega Mall, Sunshine City Plaza and Metro City Plaza II from 2010 to 2012. There were various performances by doctors, youth groups and singers, sharing by previous drugs abusers, educational display, anti-drugs game booths, display of "Drug Free Community" Design Competitions winning artworks, health check counters, etc. Citizens were encouraged to take part in the activities and raised any questions to medical staffs on spots. Through these programmes, we hoped to increase their awareness and knowledge of drug abuse and its harms.

The public education days also brought together different community actors, including community doctors, public and private hospitals nurses and nursing students, school heads associations, federations of parents and teachers associations, NGOs, etc. The HKMA successfully strengthened its relations with these actors and hoped for further collaboration in future beat drugs projects.

The public education days were effective channel for direct mass public education against drugs abuse. It was estimated that a total of 162,500 persons participated in the five public education days.
