Introduction

Illicit drug use remains a serious problem affecting youths in HK, preventive education and publicity are necessary to reinforce the anti-drug message in the teenage group. Teachers, social workers, as well as parents should be equipped with the necessary knowledge about the harms of the drug abuse, and being able to identify the early sign of dependent drug use.

A series of interactive lectures and laboratory sessions were organized under this project to provide a comprehensive information about drugs. Through the experience sharing by the past drug addicts, the participants also learnt more about the harmful effect of drug abuse.

The lectures and laboratory sessions were filmed, edited programme was broadcasted on TV and online platforms to further promote the anti-drug message. DVDs were also produced and distributed the social agencies and schools.

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Experience Gained

- Detail information given by the lecture speaker provides comprehensive knowledge to the participants.
 - Experience sharing by the past drug addicts and professionals during the lecture raise the participants' awareness of drug abuse.
 - Laboratory sessions allow the participants to have hands-on experience, the interesting process deepen their impression, and they have shown interest in learning.
- TV programme reach the general public, with the heartfelt sharing of the interviewees, to promote antidrug message effectively.













Conclusion

- Most of the participants considered the activity as useful and effective in promoting anti-drug message. Lectures provide comprehensive information to strengthen the audiences' knowledge.
 - Evaluation of the laboratory sessions shown a significant improvement in participant's knowledge about drug harms. Experimental studies demonstrating the toxic effects of drug abuse are interesting and effective in promoting drug message.
- Besides the academic studies, 6 past drugs addict were interviewed in the TV programme, they shared their experience, the physical, psychological and emotional problems of taking drugs. These interviews provide more realistic and convincing evidences in promoting anti-drug message.
- TV programme reach the general public by broadcasting on 7 TV and online platforms, including Cable TV, McTV, LeEco, Roadshow, YouTube, Tudou and Youku.
- DVDs also produced and distributed to 100 organizations.
