





Introduction

 "Life Architect III" targeted specifically young female night club workers and hidden young people with drug issues. After engaging the target participants through physical and internet outreaching, positive development programs and drug rehabilitation services were provided with a view to increase these young people's motivation to quit drugs and reduce their drug use frequency.

Output and Outcome Evaluation

- Output were evaluated based on the number of people being reached by physical or online outreaching, and the number of people being served during different kinds of activities
- Beat Drugs Fund Question Set No. 6, 8 and tailor made questionnaires were deployed to evaluate the effectiveness of the project.

Output Evaluation

Output Indicator 5	To identify 5,000 hidden drug abusers or at-risk youths on internet via social media applications and forums	32,296 (646%)
Output Indicator 6	To provide online outreach drug education to 500 hidden youths via social media application tools and web- based intervention	517 (103%)
Output Indicator 7	To engage 250 young drug abusers on internet to attend off-line services	260 (104%)

Outcome **Evaluation**



	Expected Result	Achieved Result
Outcome Indicator	70% of participants show understanding about their risk of drug abuse	<u>*</u>
Outcome Indicator 2	70% of participants increase in their quitting motivation (or statistically significant improvement found using paired t-test)	85.9% of participants increased their motivation in quitting drugs
Outcome Indicator	70% of participants reduce drug use frequency	422 valid questionnaires collected, among which 415 reported drug use and 7 reported no drug use at pre-test Out of 415 participants who reported drug use at pre-test, 83.1% reduced drug use frequency
Outcome Indicator 4	70% of hidden young drug abusers show positive change in attitude towards drug abuse	96.6% of hidden young drug abusers showed

Experience Gained



- Developing a regular and stable outreach service and upholding an non judgmental attitude towards people from nightclub are very important when engaging the nightclub community as this has made social workers become insiders of this sensitive community, and female workers are more willing to reveal their situation to social workers
- Use of social media especially Facebook is very important when engaging hidden drug abusers, we can make use of the snowball effect to engage new targets as well as update the situations of them when they are not ready to meet social workers face to face
- Other then drug rehabilitation, connecting nightclub workers and hidden drug abusers back to the community is very important because this provides alternative experience for them live without drugs and with positive networks.

Conclusion



- When providing drug counselling to young adult drug abusers, it is not
 enough just to discuss their drug taking behaviors with them as most of
 their reason behind are more complicated, a holistic approach is more
 appropriate where it tackles the real reason of their drug abuse.
- When tackling the drug issues of the targets, it is important to assess if they have other addiction issues such as alcohol addiction as well.
- Expanding target groups to older age and working young adult are suggested.
- Developing a gender sensitive approach to female drug abusers, especially those who work in night entertainment industry is very important as how they see themselves as women/ girl friends/ wife/ mothers are always related to their drug taking behaviors.
 Empowerment work towards these women would definitely help on their drug issues.
