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



Project Content

- I. Counselling Service: 58 drug dependent gay youths receive counselling service with 678 sessions
- 2. Drug Prevention Group: 125 gay youths attend the group with 375 man-times.
- 3. Expressive Arts Therapy Group: 6 groups with 39 gay men attended
- 4. Healthy Lifestyle Group: 28 Drug dependence gay youths & 49 High risk gay youths attended

Project Content

- 5. Online Outreach: Total 1075 gay men were engaged among which 436 were drug taking.
 384 gay men were provided with online counselling and 90 were referred to offline service
- 6. Gay Event Outreach: 2 300 gay men were provided drug education
- 7. HIV Outreach: 575 gay men were provided with HIV test counselling service with 72 gay men received motivational interview

Project Content

- 8. Professional Training: 63 social workers and addiction workers received the 3 days training
- 7 social workers or addiction workers attended the advanced supervision group
- 24 gay men with addiction participated in 9 sessions of group coaching

Project Content

- 9. Community Education: An instagram account was completed and published. 9 posters and 2 movies were made with total 61458 views.
- 10. A research report about the effectiveness of creative arts therapy program for gay people addicted CF was produced.
- II. A online practice manual about using art for gay people addicted CF was finished

Output and Outcome Benchmarks

Due to the adverse effects brought about by COVID-19, adjustments has been made to some output and outcome targets.

Experience Gained

- Experience in working with gay men struggling with ChemSex.
- Experience in drug prevention program and education with gay youths.
- Using expressive arts therapy to support gay youths who addicted Chem Fun.

Reason behind success


- The project are closely work with Project touch helps the participants build up a normal gay life without drug. It helps the participants have a higher motivation in quitting drug.
- The sensitivity of gay culture contributed the positive result of the project in both anti drug education part and treatment part.

Overall evaluation

- The project provided drug prevention education for the gay community both in online and offline method
 - The online education and outreach activity shows an over achieved target.
 - The sharing of some ex-chem fun particiaptor is meaningful.
- The project provided treatment for drug dependent gay youths, through counseling, expressive art group and healthy life style group.
 - 75.4% of clients received counselling service showed an improvement in their quitting motivation
 - 84 % of the clients showed a reduction on drug use grequency.

Overall evaluation

- The project reduced the possibility of taking drug among high risk gay youths.
 - Build up healthy supported network is important on building up resilience.
 - 71.4% of participants of drug prevention group showed a higher level of risk associated with drug abuse
 - 73.2% of participants showed a lower level of permissiveness towards drug abuse.
- The project built up the capacity of relative professional on working with drug dependent gay youths
- The project developed a local prevention and treatment model for gay youths.



Suggestion and way forward

- Take care the difficulty as a gay men is a essential part in dealing Chemfun issue.
- For a better support to Chemfun user, more training about the knowledge of LGBT special needs should be organise.
- A different service program should be develop to target on the adult and the adolescent who participants in Chemfun.
