










Background

To involve medical professionals in the process of drug abuse assessment and treatment is important



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- Sponsored by BDF

- Adopt <u>medical-social outreaching approach</u> to provide one-stop drug treatment and rehabilitation services

362 interview sessions for patients



Over 70% patients showed improvement in motivation to change








Service output

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In COVID-19, our team

- 1. Continues hospital-based outreaching through online communication software
- 2. Recruits high-risk groups to attend online and face-to-face health talks and health programs
- 3. Holds counselling groups to high risk groups to motivate them to stay far away from drugs

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Overview of Service outcome (2018-2021)

Evaluation method: Beat Drugs Fund Question Set No. 13 (Pre-test and post-test survey)

	Expected outcome	Actual outcome
Outcome Indicator 1	Hospital-based support services 50 % of drug abusers show improvement in their motivation to quit drugs	71.8% of drug abusers show improvement in their motivation to quit drugs
Outcome Indicator 2	Community-based support services 40 % of drug abusers show improvement in their motivation to quit drugs	60.6 % of drug abusers show improvement in their motivation to quit drugs
