Private clinics/hospital Public hospital General outpatient clinics Special outpatient clinics


Is it expensive if I see doctor in Hong Kong? For eligible persons: A&E: HKD\$180 GOPC: HKD\$50 SOPC: HKD\$135 Private clinics: varied

If I do not have money, can I see doctor?


You can see doctor first and pay the bill later. If you have financial difficulties, you can consult MSW and see if you are eligible for medical waiver. What if I do not have HKID? I only have "Immigration paper" (行街紙). Still, you can see doctor.


Special case: If you are refugees/Asylum seeker, you can apply for medical waiver at SWD/MSW.


Healthcare system in Hong Kong



GOPC vs A&E

General Outpatient Clinics	Accident & Emergency Department
(GOPC)	(A&E)
 Fever without rash Vomiting and Diarrhea Mild Injury (e.g. Sprain, superficial wound) Sore throat Dysuria 	 Chest pain Shortness of Breath Severe pain over back and abdomen, paralyse, numbness Slurred speech, sudden change over mental status Newborn fever Fracture, dislocation High fever+/- rash Severe and persistent vomiting and diarrhea Burnt wound, bleeding wound (unable to stop bleeding)

Average waiting time for A&E service

	Triage I	Triage II	Triage III	Triage IV	Triage
	Critical	Emergency	Urgent	Semi-urgent	Non-urgent
Waiting time (mins)	0	7	25	113	125

The waiting time in hospital is so long. I don't have to wait that long in my home country!

If it is mild case, GOPC is a better place.

General Out-patient Clinics

I am not able to speak in Cantonese or English, how can I communicate with the doctors?

Confidentiality

I do not want to use the interpretation service because the interpreter will know my "secret".

Interpretation Service

Even though some of our service users can speak simple English, interpretation service is still recommended.

Reason:

- 1. Medical terms
- 2. Facilitate communication

General Out-patient Clinics

Two ways of making appointments

Often

full

It is always full when I make appointments. A patient can book an appointment in the next 24 hours if quota is available.

Telephone

system

e.g. 10am now => the latest appointment you can book is 10am tomorrow

Trick:

The telephone system will update at every exact hour. So it is easier to book right after it.

e.g. 10:05



"HA Go" App

The App can show the availability of each clinic. Easier to book by the App.

Remember the "Rx" Logo!

In HK, licensed drug retailers include:

- 1. Register pharmacy
- According to the Laws of Hong Kong, "Pharmacy" or "Dispensary" is a restricted title for a shop granted a valid licence of "Authorized Seller of Poisons" (ASP).
- 2. Licensed medicine store
- Known as "drug store"

The difference between pharmacy and drugstore

	Pharmacy	Drugstore
Using the title of "Pharmacy" or "Dispensary" (Chi: 藥房)	\checkmark	Х
Using "Rx" logo	\checkmark	Х
With duty pharmacist in shop	\checkmark	Х
Dispense prescription drugs (under supervision of a pharmacist)	\checkmark	Х
Sell pharmacist-only controlled medicines	\checkmark	Х
Sell common drugs, such as cold and flu medicine	\checkmark	\checkmark

Category of medicines

Cat.	Professional supervision	Nature of medicine and examples	Sales location
1	Doctor's prescriptionPharmacist's supervision	• Often used for treatment of more serious or chronic illness.	Pharmacy
2	- Pharmacist's supervision	 May cause more side effects than medicines in category 3. Examples: cough syrup with low codeine content 	Pharmacy
3	x	 Used to treat or relieve mild symptoms, with fewer side effects. Examples: cold & flu drugs such as Coltalin (幸福 傷風素) 	Pharmacy or licensed medicine store

Sometimes I can buy prescription drugs without doctor's prescription in pharmacy. Is it ok? Not recommended - One of the "grey areas" in Hong Kong

E.g. cough syrup with Codeine

- Can cause addiction

Sometimes I do not know what kinds of drugs I should buy for my sickness. I tried to seek opinions from the staff in the pharmacy, but they do not look like medical professionals.

Current regulations of pharmacy in HK:

- A registered pharmacy must have pharmacist on duty in at least ²/₃ of its opening hours!
- You can find the following information at a conspicuous location in the pharmacy:
 - 1. Name of the pharmacist
 - 2. Certificate of registration of the pharmacy

3. A notice listing out the attendance hours of the pharmacist

Reminder:

- 1. Shop owner/staff =/= pharmacist
- 2. Some pharmacies **<u>do NOT</u>** really follow the regulations.



Someone told me that this medicine can treat COVID-19 infection. Can I buy it in pharmacy?

Reminder: 1. Please buy it from proper channel.

2. Better consult with your doctor before taking it.

3. Do not take it together with other medicines.

4. Not for prevention!





District Health Centre (DHC) / DHC express

Purpose:

- 1. Raise public awareness on personal health management
- 2. Enhance disease prevention
- 3. Alleviate pressure of public hospitals

Key functions of DHC:





Health promotion




Disease prevention and screening

Who can be a member of DHC?

- 1. Holder of HKID; and
- 2. Agrees to enrol to eHRSS (醫健通)
- 3. Living or working in the corresponding DHC

Two ways to enrol:

- You can register directly at DHC
- Referral by other healthcare providers

Each district has its own DHC / DHC express

Dental service in Hong Kong

Private dental services are expensive in Hong Kong. Is there any public dental service? Most of public dental clinics only serve civil servants and their relatives. For those serve general public, the services only include **extraction and medication (for pain-relief)**.

The Prince Philip Dental Hospital

- Established under the Prince Philip Dental Hospital Ordinance (Cap. 1081)
- Funded by government
- To train dentist and other dental-related allied health professionals




Offer services for teaching patients with reasonable price !

Service fees for teaching patients: Fee Level w.e.f. 1 Apr 2018 ITEM Attendance fee (per day visit) (payable for all treatments other than dental hygiene therapy and orthodontics) \$50 Dental hygiene therapy fee (whole course of treatment) 2. \$100 Non-surgical Periodontal Treatment (per package) Gingivitis (for a maximum of 6 visits) \$ 300 Mild-moderate periodontitis (for a maximum of 8 visits) 2. \$400 Severe periodontitis (for a maximum of 10 visits) \$ 500 3.

My child sometimes abuses drugs. What should I do?


Remember! There is always help in the community.

The first step is to assess the emotions / needs of the parent!

Community services for substance abuse

- 1. <u>Outpatient Methadone Treatment Programme</u>
- 2. Substance Abuse Clinics



Non-medical approach

- 3. Residential Drug Treatment and Rehabilitation Centres and Halfway Houses
- 4. Counselling Centre for Psychotropic Substance Abusers (CCPSA)
- 5. Centre for Drug Counselling (CDC)

Health Communication


I'm healthy. I do not need these healthcare service/ community resources. When our service users are identified with health issue, some may deny it.


